

Mary Ann Buck's cheerful 19th century sampler no doubt includes scenes that give us a clue to her rural surroundings. While she lets us know she was just 10 years old when she stitched her sampler, she didn't note a date or location. We see perhaps a bull charging out of the barnyard gate (that looks almost as if it came off the pages of Doctor Who).

She chose the first two verses of an anonymous four-verse hymn that was published with several titles: Birth Date, Child's Birth Day, Passing Time and A Birth Day Prayer.

model stitched on 36ct *Mason Linen* with silks and 2 DMC, and
the eyelet stitches were replaced with Smyrna crosses.

I can't remember when there's been a sampler as popular as this one with our customers. We continue to ship the chart, linen, and thread kits for this stunning sampler. And Beth has kindly allowed us to continue to exhibit her exquisite model for a bit longer, so I'm going to continue to include Dorcas's beautiful work in the newsletter.





Linda Vinson, *Needlemade Designs*

Linda tells us this about her project for this year: *The project is a sliding boxes reticule based on an English sampler, Mary Ranson 1798, and a Chinese antique reticule that I own. To go inside the reticule is a needle book, a scissors case and fob, and possibly one or two other pieces depending on what I can work out on the piece of fabric.*


- * TWO FOR JOY \$8, 217 x 127 ~ Ruthie includes information about her inspiration for this original design, including the verse: "One for sorrow; Two for joy; Three for a girl; Four for a boy; Five for silver; Six for gold; Seven for a secret, never to be told"
- * ANN HARDCASTLE 1844, 129 x 240, charted in DMC
- * HARRIET HEBBLETHWAITE 1824 \$15, 246 x 316, charted in DMC for the faded colors on the front but, if you prefer the original brighter colors, there is also a DMC conversion to those colors shown on the back.



Below from the left:

- * THE HOLLY BEARS THE CROWN 1814 11, 187 x 283, charted in overdyed cottons with a DMC conversion
- * HANNAH MARY SCHOFIELD 1867 \$8, 175 x 186 ~ Hannah used the 4-sided stitch for the capitols of her name, one of my favorite stitches
- * SARAH FOOTIT 1821 \$8, 187 x 199, charted in overdyed cottons with a DMC conversion





Two above:

Two Norfolk samplers, a favorite sampler genre of mine ~ both charts include a great deal of genealogy on the sampler makers:

- * MARY ANN KITTLE 1813 \$15, 229 x 288, charted with DMC in two color options, muted like the front or the brighter back colors ~ I LOVE this sampler!
- * MARIA FRISTON 1802 \$15, 238 x 336, charted with DMC for the original back colors and, for the faded front colors, two suggested overdyes

Two on the left:

- * MARIA FRISTON'S PINCUSHION DRUM 1802 \$8.50, top - 61 x 65, side 203 x 93
- * MARY JENKINS 1772 \$15, 161 x 272







Clockwise from above:

- * RED BERRIES, A Christmas Greeting \$7, 138 x 114 ~ I absolutely LOVE this one, always have, from the moment I laid eyes on it. Then why haven't I stitched it? It only has 2 colors, red and green, and on 56ct it's only 5 x 4, a lovely ornament size!
- * HOW DOTH THE LITTLE BUSY BEE, A Beekeeper's Pincushion, \$7.50, 94 x 107 ~ And wouldn't this make a lovely pincushion; on 40ct, 4.7 x 5.4! Perfect!
- * LOVE LETTERS \$8, 85 x 115; on 40ct, 4.2 x 5.7. How perfect to stitch your love's initials in a different color!
- * LFB 1788, A Red Deer Sampler \$21, 271 x 282 ~ This chart booklet is a must own even if you don't intend to stitch it. It's filled with Dutch history, admittedly something I'd known little about. The *best* part for me is that Jacob includes 2 1/2 pages of explanations about the motifs included by LFB.
- * IAB 1817, The Rosebush Sampler \$18, 256 x 255, on 40ct 12.8 x 12.8 ~ I LOVE this sampler, not only because of the roses but also the border ... as Jacob points out, "which is not a simple repeat border and is a constantly changing bouquet of flowers and birds."


Our parents, Meta & Jerome, "till death do us part," will celebrate 81 years in August in heaven.
